CIA LIBRARY

The Polish Ambassador, Jan Karol Wende, returned to Belgrade from Warsaw on 7 April 1949; the Bulgarian Ambassador, Pelo Pelovski, returned to Belgrade sometime during the first week of April, 1949 and is at present in Belgrade. The Rumanian Ambassador, Teodor Rudenco, also is reported to have returned. The Czech Ambassador allegedly stated to a friend that he expected to be replaced. M. Jozsef Marzai, Chargé d'Affaires at the Hungarian Legation, has been in Belgrade since his Minister, Zoltan Szanto, left Belgrade during the first week in February. There has been no word on Soviet Ambassador Anatolij Lavrentiev, who left Belgrade during December; Grigorij Shnjukov, Chargé d'Affaires, has been seen frequently during the past three months. There has been no activity at the Albanian Legation since the departure of the Press Attaché in late February, 1949.
