25X1 Yugoslav Reserve Army

25X1 1. The Reserve Army of Yugoslavia consists of the Third Army. The General Staff of this army is in Novi Sad. The commanding officer at present is Lt. General Milan Kupresanin.

25X1 2. The Third Army consists of:

- a. 12 Assault Division stationed at Sremska Mitrovica. The commanding officer is General Micunovic.
- b. 36 Vojvodina Division at Petrovgrad. The commanding officer is General Zurkotic.
- c. 45 Macedonian Division at Subotica. The commanding officer is General Vuletic.
- d. 47 Assault Division at Debeljaka.
- e. 51 Assault Division stationed at Sember (Vojvodina).

3. The 16 Vojvodina Division, previously at Petrovaradin is now transferred to Stip and is attached to the Fifth Army. Its commanding officer is General Petricevic.

4. The 45 Macedonian Division, formerly attached to the First Army and stationed at Topola, now belongs to the Third Army and is stationed at Subotica.

Mountain Troops

5. The mountain troops are special units which take part in battles in the mountains and are under the commander of the Supreme Military Command.

6. In case of an attack or of occupation of a foreign country, these forces are to be put at the head of the local units as well.

7. These mountain troops compose:
- a. 1 Mountain Division at Delnice
 - b. 2 Mountain Division at Negotin
 - c. 3 Mountain Division at Skofija Loka.

Central Units of Tito's Army

8. The central units of Tito's army are those which are stationed in the area of the Sixth Army, whose headquarters are in Sarajevo. The commanding officer is Lt. General Mihajlo Apostolaki.
9. Those units are:
- a. Koruska Division stationed at Tuzla. The commanding officer is General Mitic.
 - b. 9 Assault Division at Titovgrad. The commanding officer is General Truta.
 - c. 31 Assault Division at Berane.
 - d. 29 Herzegovina Division at Mostar. The commanding officer is General Bratic.
 - e. 25 Assault Division at Prnjavor.
 - f. 30 Assault Division at Trebinje.
 - g. 35 Assault Division at Banja Luka.
 - h. 38 Serbian Division at Sarajevo. The commanding officer is Heljevic.
 - i. 39 Bosnian Division at Jajce.

Armored Army

10. The armored Army is under the immediate command of the Supreme Military Command. Its General Staff is at Pancevo. The commanding officer of this army is General Kovacevic.
11. The armored army is composed of:
- a. 1 Armored Corps stationed at Petrovaradin. It includes:
 - (1) 1 Armored Division at Kranj. The commanding officer is General Stapar.
 - (2) 2 Armored Division at Skoplje. The commanding officer is General Filipovic
 - b. 9 Corps of Engineers stationed at Zagreb. This also includes 1 and 2 Infantry Divisions.

South Front

12. The defense of the South Front is assigned to the First and Fifth Armies. The commander of this Front is General Kosta Nadj.

First Army

13. The General Staff of the First Army is at Kragujevac. Peko Dapcevic formerly commanded this army. He is now appointed Inspector General of the Yugoslav Army. The new commander has not yet been named.

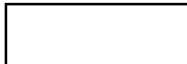

- b. 10 Krayina Division at Kragujevac. The commanding officer is General Krejci.
- c. 11 Proletarian Division at Zajecar. The commanding officer is General Vidulic.
- d. 21 Serbian Assault Division at Nis. The commanding officer is General Bajic.
- e. 37 Assault Division at Uzice. The commanding officer is Colonel Kesap.
- f. 46 Assault Division at Petrovac.
