1. Dr. Kurt Richter was sent from Moscow to Novosibirsk [redacted] to solve difficulties in ceramic-soldering. The particular troubles were discontinuities and leaks. After three months, Richter returned to Moscow.

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2. Dr. Kurt J. Kosterhon, previously with Leuna Werke, Weissenfels, Saxony, is a German specialist on ammonia. [redacted] he was taken with a group of scientists from Leuna Werke to Moscow.

3. Dr. Asinger, an Austrian scientist from the Leuna Werke, Weissenfels, Saxony, was also in the group with Dr. Kosterhon which was taken to Moscow [redacted]

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4. Nikolaus Riehl is the former head of the research department of the Auer Gesellschaft. [redacted] Riehl is at Moscow-Electrostal working on the refining of uranium.

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5. Dr. Bewilogua, a specialist on low-temperature physics, was formerly editor of the Physikalische Zeitschrift, published by Hirzel, Leipzig. [redacted]

6. Dr. Carl Friedrich Weiss, a nuclear physicist and expert on radio-active standards, [redacted]

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7. Kalbitz, formerly Chief Engineer of the Berlin Siemens works, went to Moscow by plane voluntarily

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8. Prof. Scheffers, formerly with the Physikalisch-Technische Reichsanstalt and lecturer of theoretical physics at the Technische Hochschule in Berlin, had specialized on super-conductivity and low temperature physics when he was in Germany.

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9. Dr. Barwich went to the USSR [Redacted] he is with Hertz, and Schutze, with whom he had gone to the USSR [Redacted] Barwich is a very good physicist with ultra-sound as his speciality.

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10. Schutze is a [Redacted] specialist in mass spectroscopy and cyclotrons, who went to the USSR [Redacted] with Gustav Hertz and Barwich.

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11. Dr. Gustav Hertz, former Director of the Research Laboratory at the Siemens-Halske works in Germany, was head of a group of German scientists taken to the USSR

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12. Dr. Paul Herold previously Director of the Scientific and Research Laboratory of the Leuna Werke, [Redacted] and was taken to the USSR

[Redacted] Herold may be doing work similar to that which he did at the Heydebreck works in Upper Silesia during the war. At Heydebreck, Herold was a specialist in organic chemistry and worked on scheming, proportioning, and distributing of different gases for synthesizing processes used for fuel for V-weapons, jet-engines, and submarines.
