A long row of four or five white code panels on the landing field indicated that planes were expected to land there. The truck loaded with reels of telephone cable, with a trailer moved toward 25X1A the edge of the landing field. All kasernes south of the RFURT-BIND LEBRE road were occupied by German civilians. 25X1X 27 September 1949 All civilians living at the FRFURT-BINDER SLEBEN airfield were ordered to place their flats at the disposal of Soviet flying personnel between 29 September and 11 October 1949. 30 September 1949 One U-2 biplane (machine gun at rear seat, a white "6" on fuselage) landed at the field. A formation of 40 bombers escorted by 20 fighters, coming from the east, landed there about one hour later. The bombers flying in medge formations of seven planes each were circled by the fighters flying in elements of two. Description of bombers: Low-wing monoplane, two in-line engines, tail skid visible in flight, upper section of nose clazed, machine gun aft of cockpit, antenna leading from cockpit to rudder assembly, graygreen paint. Comment:

- a. The ERFURY-BIYDERSLEBEH airfield has so far not been occupied by an air unit. Air transport units occasionally landed in connection with army maneuvers held in Thuringia.
- b. From the information that the field kasernes had to be evacuated by the civilians for a limited period it is inferred that the bombers and fighters arriving at the field on 30 September 1949 were probably to be temporarily stationed there. According to the descriptions, the aircraft were Pe-2s and Yak-3s.
