1. It is reported that Josef Welker, Charge d'Affaires of the Polish Legation in Mexico City during the absence of Minister Jan Drohojowski, expects to depart from Mexico for Warsaw in January 1950 on a new assignment.
2. Welker allegedly believes that he will be ordered to Bucharest as Ambassador. However, he intends to use all influence possible to have his assignment changed to Moscow as First or Second Secretary. He is said to be interested in arranging this transfer in order to attend the Political and Diplomatic School which is maintained in Moscow to which certain trusted non-Soviet diplomats are admitted.
3. Welker's replacement is Edward Bartol, Counselor of the Polish Embassy in Washington, D. C., whom [redacted] to assume ultimately the title and position of Ambassador.
