1. Three trains with a total of about 120 flatcars, loaded with Goviet motor vehicles, passed through SIERADZ (\$52/C 42). According to rumors, these trains came from Silesia and were to preceed northward.

2. One train of 30 flatears loaded with Soviet guns passed through TOMASZOW-MAZOWTECKI (1) 52/P 31) and proceeded west.

Several west-bound ammunition trains moved through TOMASZOW-MAZOWIECKI.


## Comment:

a. Another source reported that a Soviet tank unit was entrained in LIEGHTZ for an unidentified destination in late October 1949. It cannot be stated whether the trains which passed through SIERADZ carried troops and materiel withdrawn from the LIEGHTZ area,or whether they carried routine shipments of motor vehicles to be repaired or already repaired.

b. The train with Soviet guns observed in TOMASZOW-MAZO-WIECKI, possibly proceeded to the Soviet Zone of Germany.
