The target-towing planes flew as low as 150 to 300 feet and as high as 6,560 feet. The score was considered satisfactory. The terget was missed only about ten times out of 150 approaches. Toward the end of the firing practice, riflemen practiced firing at towed sleeve targets. This score was also satisfactory. Gorman 200-cm searchlights, powered by generators, were used at night. Leven searchlights with three generators were observed with one searchlight battery. This battery "passed on" the targettowing He-III mireraft to other batteries during the practices.
