1. Of the seventy-seven organizations of Chinese registered with the government of Macao, about one third are dominated or controlled by the Chinese Communist Party. Communist tactics depended largely upon penetration until the Nationalist defeat in South China, when the party became openly active. Three organizations have been particularly recognized as Communist groups: The Overseas Chinese Association, the New Democracy Association, and the Chung Hua Educational Association.*
2. In addition to these organizations, other groups in Macao which are Communist controlled or dominated include the following, with the principal officers of each:
 - a. Associated Trade Union of Foreign and Chinese Tailors, chairman LIANG Kuei-tao (梁貴道).
 - b. Associated Trade Union of Department Stores in Macao, secretary YEH Pau-ju (葉守如).
 - c. Barbers' Union, secretary MIN Ch'ueh-ch'u (閔覺初).
 - d. Charity Association of Ching Hu (鏡湖) Hospital, chairman HO Hsien (何賢), hospital chief, K'IO Lin (柯麟).**
 - e. Chinese Chamber of Commerce, director, LIU Po-ying (劉柏盈), with deputies HO Hsien and MO P'ei-yüeh (莫培猷).
 - f. Ch'ing Yüan (清遠) Fellow Citizens' Association, secretary, LI Shen (李森), LI Kuei (李桂), and CHOU Ch'ao (周超).
 - g. Chung Hua (中華) Educational Association, chairman to be elected in late November 1949, secretaries, TU Lan (杜蘭), HO Hsin-yüan (何心源), and CH'EN Tao-ken (陳道根).

3. The Chinese Communists have a special commissioner for Macao, with an office staff organized as follows:
 - a. Special Commissioner: MEI Wen-ting (梅文鼎)**
 - b. Secretary: LIANG Chia (梁嘉)**
 - c. Economic Section: MEI Wen-ting.
 - d. Liaison Section: MEI Wen-ting .
 - e. Organization Section: K'O Lin.
 - f. Operations Section: LIANG Chia.
 - g. Propaganda Section: CH'EN Chih-sheng (陳直生).
 - h. Recruiting and Training Section: LU Wei (盧偉).

4. The Macao branch headquarters of the Chinese Communist Party includes the following personnel:
 - a. Chief Commissioner: K'O Lin.
 - b. Commissioners: LI Shao-pai (李少白)** K'UO Hsing (郭興), CHENG Ch'eng-hai (鄭登海), and YANG Ching-min (楊靖明).
 - c. Secretary: KUO Hsing.
 - d. General Executive Secretary: CH'EN Chih-sheng, deputy PI Ying (畢應).
 - e. Education Section: CHENG Ch'eng-hai.
 - f. Propaganda Section: LI Shao-pai.
 - g. Operation Section: YANG Ching-min.

5. Communist policy appears to be to restrict action to propaganda until the situation of Hongkong is completely clarified. Some conflict for domination of local Communist activities appeared in early November between the Overseas Chinese Association sponsor K'O Lin and the leader of the New Democracy Association HUANG Chien.** They issue separate propaganda materials, the more forceful coming from HUANG and the more subtle from K'O. HUANG has strengthened his personal prestige by open opposition to Macao government authority, while K'O has worked through his own organization and the Chinese Chamber of Commerce.

6. The Communist offices in Macao received orders in December 1949 to investigate the Macao attitude towards the Chinese Communists, Macao government trade transactions, supplies and trading stocks on hand, and the amount and type of supplies and property belonging to Nationalist elements in Macao.
