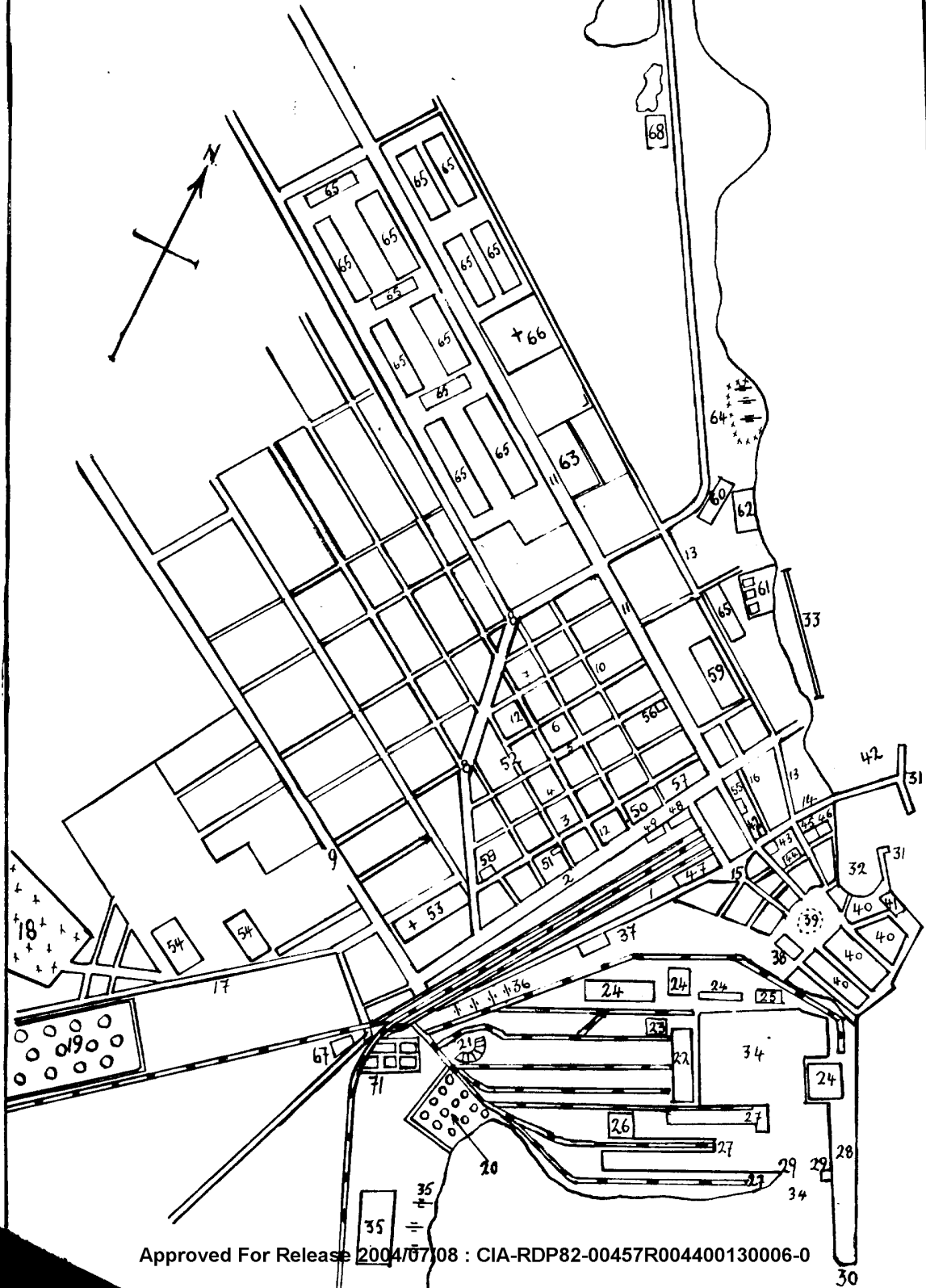
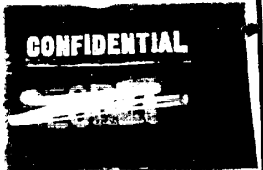

- 1 - Station street.
- 2 - Strada Republicii (formerly Ferdinand Street).
- 3 - Casa Voda street
- 4 - Stefan Cel Mare street.
- 5 - Grivitei street.
- 6 - Ilie Pintilie street (formerly Take Ionescu street).
- 7 - Tudor Vladimirescu street
- 8 - Regina Maria street.
- 9 - Atalierelor street.
- 10 - Skarlat Varlam street.
- 11 - Marshal Stalin street. (formerly King Carol street).
- 12 - Ion Lahovari street.
- 13 - Principele Mircea street.
- 14 - Ion Karadjale street.
- 15 - Traian street.
- 16 - Costache Negri street.
- 17 - Bratiamu street.
- 18 - Town cemetery
- 19 - Oil reservoirs and refineries. The area was enclosed by a brick wall about two meters high.
- 20 - Oil tanks damaged by Allied bombing during the war. The damage was not considerable and the tanks were being repaired.
- 21 - Locomotive depot, capable of accommodating 10 to 12 locomotives. This was a brick construction covered with white corrugated sheet metal.
- 22 - ~~Site~~
- 23 - Electric power station producing current for the port area.
- 24 - Warehouses.
- 25 - Harbormaster's office.
- 26 - Shipyards. Three or four ships sunk during the war and subsequently salvaged were undergoing repairs.
- 27 - Wharves.
- 28 - Large breakwater
- 29 - Navigation lights at the port entrance.
- 30 - Breakwater light
- 31 - Two small breakwaters. Since early 1948 work has been carried out to extend these breakwaters. Concrete blocks

were used in this construction. One was to be extended to a length of 100 to 150 meters, the other to a length of 50 to 60 meters wide and 2 to 2 1/2 meters. Both will be about 4 meters wide and 2 to 2 1/2 meters above sea level.

- 32 - Small harbor used as anchorage for fishing craft.
- 33 - Old breakwater
- 34 - At this location dredgers were seen operating in early 1948.
- 35 - Barracks. On the seaward side of the barracks two or three guns were located on fixed

- 36 - Four guns on fixed emplacements. This is a two storey brick building which was occupied by an unspecified Soviet unit.
- 38 - Town Council.
- 39 - Ovidiu square
- 40 - Buildings occupied by an unspecified Soviet unit.
- 41 - Barracks occupied by an unspecified Soviet unit.
- 42 - Central telephone exchange.
- 43 - Post, telegraph and telephone building.
- 44 - Greek school.
- 45 - Greek Orthodox Church.
- 46 - Buildings belonging to the Greek community.
- 47 - Railway station.
- 48 - Single storey brick building which was used as a Rumanian military club.
- 49 - Small buildings and sheds used by Rumanian railway guards.
- 50 - Areal administration offices.
- 51 - Soviet Consulate General.
- 52 - Market place.
- 53 - Public hospital. This was a one-storey building.
- 54 - Soviet military stores. These were two large two-storey buildings previously used as grain warehouses.
- 55 - Offices of the General Workers Confederation.
- 56 - Offices of the Greek Communist Party
- 57 - Carlton hotel. This was the largest hotel in Constanta and was occupied by Soviet officers.
- 58 - Offices of the Social Insurance.
- 59 - Former kircea Lyceum, occupied by an unspecified Soviet unit. Officers were observed instructing units in map reading.
- 60 - Military hospital. It was not known whether the hospital was used by Soviet or Rumanian forces.
- 61 - Three buildings occupied by the Rumanian security services.
- 62 - Civil prison. This was the former shore restaurant center known as Tataia.
- 63 - Old civil prison. This was still in use.
- 64 - An unspecified number of guns located here.
- 65 - Barracks occupied by an unspecified Soviet unit.
- 66 - Rumanian church.
- 67 - Slaughter house.
- 68 - Town electric power station.
- 69 - Village of Mamaia. This village was completely occupied by the Soviets.
- 70 - Mamaia beach. The public was allowed to use this beach only occasionally.
- 71 - Suburb inhabited by dockworkers and railway
