(M 53/D 69) airfield. Description: In-line engine, two-bladed propeller, water cooled, painted dark green, Soviet star on white field, armaments or antenna rods not identified. b. Five more biplanes, apparently of the same type, were parked in an open hangar. Two persons left a biplane which had apparently just landed. The person who sat in the rear carried a hand operated aircraft camera to the flight control station. A sentry with black epaulets and armed with a pistol was at the field entrance gate. Twenty soldiers wearing blue or black epaulets passed through the gate within two hours. Some of the soldiers with black service color had the flying insagnia on their epaulets. Passenger cars 🗆 🖿 the latter with an air force driver, were parked at the entrance of the field. Except for 10 soldiers working on the aircraft no other Soviets were seen. 3. The landing field had a good grass cover (for location see Annex), The cantonment bu ldings beside the hangar were occupied. Eight fuel barrels, one with a fuel pump operated by hand, were stored nearby. 25X1C Comment: According to the description of the aircraft the planes are of R-5 type (an obsolescent air reconnaissance plane).
