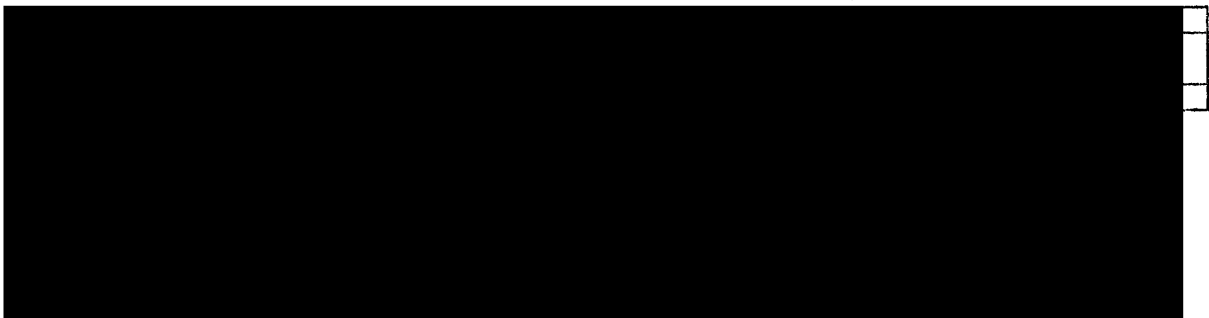

1. A new subversive group has been organized in Djakarta by Hadiono Kusumo Utoyo\*, Rekso Diputro\*\*, and Sutjahjo\*\*\*. The purpose of the group is to undermine the structure of the present government of the Republik Indonesia Serikat (RIS).
  2. The organization operates by encouraging disagreement between the Indonesian Republic and the RIS. Officials sent from Jogjakarta to Djakarta to work are being asked to stop working for "the marionette of Britain and America."
  3. Two other important men engaged in this activity are Dachlan, a tailor and a Darul Islam leader in Djakarta at Gang Abdullah, Unielaan and Mohammed Djoni\*\*\*\*, chairman of the Red Partai Komunis Indonesia (PKI), Gedong Pandjang 46, Djakarta Down Town. Striking officials are given work by Djoni's Sarekat Pelajaran Indonesia (SARPELINDO). This union is able to provide work for a large number of people each day in the inter-insular sea traffic, which it controls.
  4. Riduan bin Dulo, whose address is c/o Mas Senun, Paseban Gang 2, Salemba, and Mohammed Dori, serve as verbal propagandists for the PKI. Every day between 4:30 and 7:00 p.m. they go out to try to persuade people at Salemba and Kramat to join the PKI at Gang Tengah 31, Djakarta.
- \* [REDACTED] Comment. [REDACTED], October 1949, reported Utoyo was one of two political advisers on the new council of the Serikat Buruh Kapal dan Pelabuhan (SBKP). At this time it was alleged that Utoyo had wavered in his convictions several months previously, but was quieted with a gift of f 50,000 from the Kiew Thong Exchange. 6 January 1950, named Utoyo as legal adviser to the Kiew Thong Exchange.
- \*\* [REDACTED] Comment. [REDACTED], 6 February 1950, said that Diputro apparently had taken over the leadership of the Partai Rakjat Djelata, eclipsing Saerun.
