- 1. On 24 march 1950 a battalion of the Chinese Communist Kwangtung-Kwangsi Column, about 150 men, reached Chien Shan (113-32, 22-14), north of macao, carrying two long-range field guns. The field pieces were mounted on a fort at the foot of Pei Ling (), pointing directly at macao. A reinforced platoon of the Kwangtung-Kwangsi Column was placed there to guard the place, and in early April passage near this installation was strictly forbidden.
- In early April 1950 there were about fifty armed Chinese Communist soldiers who were assigned to remain in Lacao on duty. They were staying in cheap, low-class hotels
- 3. In early April 1950 between seven and eight hundred former Nationalist soldiers were moved from Sau Fu (12) //) to Chungshan and Shihchi to engage in farming. Five hundred of the men were placed in the 5th district of Chungshan hsien, one hundred in the 6th district, and the rest were scattered through other rural areas. They were under the supervision of the Kwangtung-Kwangsi Column. The local population was ordered to contribute one cunce of rice per head to support this group.*
- 5. In early April 1950 the contract between the Lacac Bus Company and its

The employees were planning to demand changes in working hours and extra pay for work on Sunday, and a strike appeared possible if the company's reply should be unsatisfactory. The bus company's franchise from the Macao Government is valid for six years, and has three more years to run. It is unlikely that any other bus company will be established in macao prior to the expiration of this franchise.
