SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT NO. 25X1A2g

1. The following prominent leaders in the Communist Party of The Netherlands (CPN) left on 8 May 1950 for Budapest via Prague:
 - a. Berend Blokzijl, born at Hougeveen on 29 December 1918, chairman of the Communist-controlled Einheids Van Centrale (United Trade Union Central - EVC).
 - b. Johannes Frederik Wolff, born at Velsen on 14 March 1927, former national chairman of the Organisatie Progressieve Studerende Jeugd (Organization of Progressive Student Youth - OPSJ) and active in the Algemeene Nederlandse Jeugd Vereeniging (General Dutch Youth Union - ANJV). These groups are CPN-dominated youth movements. Wolff is a reporter for the CPN daily newspaper, De Waarheid, and other Communist publications.
2. Lodewijk Philips, previously reported as having gone to Budapest in early May, was a Belgian delegate to the meeting of the Executive Bureau and Executive Committee of the World Federation of Trade Unions (WFTU) held in Budapest 10-24 May 1950.
