- 1. The following prominent leaders in the Communist Party of The Metherlands (CCE) left on 8 May 1950 for Budapest via Prague:
 - a. Berend Blokziji, born at Hougeveen on 29 December 1918, chairman of the Communist-controlled Einheids Van Centralle (United Trade Union Central - EVC).
 - b. Johannes Frederik Wolff, born at Velsen on 14 March 1927, former natio al chairman of the Organisatio Progressieve Studerende Jeugd (Organization of Progressive Student Youth OPSJ) and active in the Algemeene Hederlandse Jeugd Vereenigung (General Dutch Youth Union AMJV). These groups are CPM-dominated youth movements. Wolff is a reporter for the CPM daily newspaper, De Waarheid, and other Communist publications.
- 2. Lodewiji Philips, previously reported as having gone to Budapest in early May, was a Belgian delegate to the meeting of the Executive Bureau and Executive Committee of the Morle Federation of Trade Unions (WFTU) held in Budapest 10-24 May 1950.
