- There are some Chinese in Indonesia who are dissatisfied with both the Chinese Nationalists and Communists. These Chinese may eventually form an opposition group.
- INJO Beng Goat believes that there is a possibility of such an opposition 2. group developing in Indonesia. In his opinion this group will include many Chinese who are still loyal to CHI ANG Kai-shek. He feels they will continue to back CHIANG if he successfully defends Formosa, but will join the opposition if he fails.
- According to INJO, about 200 Chinese a month are returning to Indonesia 3. from Communist China. Their stories are just beginning to circulate in the Chinese community and most of the accounts are anti-Communist, telling of starvation and bad government.
- The following influential Chinese have recently shown dissatisfaction with 4. both the Chinese Nationalists and Communists and may in the future become leaders of an opposition group:
