As usual the volume of Juschweschttrans business increased during the last two weeks of March 1950 as the first quarter of the year drew to a close and USIA firms hastened to meet Soviet delivery quotas.

1. Export Shipments Handled by Juschweschttrans

12 transformers, each weighing 600 kilograms from AEG-Union Elektrizitaets-Gesellschaft.

35 tons of quick drying paint from Vinzenz Wagner.

12 tons of quick drying paint from Ludwig Marx, Goeden.

30 tons of quick drying paint from Ebersberger Lack- und Farbenfabriken G.m.b.H., Neuengbach.

One lathe, a type used to thread screws, weighing a total of 3,700 kilograms, and one Atoll grinding machine shipped to the USIA-controlled firm, Mannesmann-Trauzl A.G. Mannesmann-Trauzl purchased the lathe for \$7,000 dollars; payment was made by a letter of credit to a bank in Paris.

25X1 48 graphite crucibles designed for use in smelting, from an unidentified firm [redacted] were shipped to Schenker & Co., Aktiengesellschaft in Vienna and turned over to Jusch-wneschtrans for delivery to Neu-Erlaa.*(8)

5 carloads of iron machinery, primarily large lathes, to Stanko-import, Moscow.

4. Juschwneschtrans personnel

During the past two weeks, Mishin, new Soviet director of Juschwneschtrans, has held personal interviews with all of Juschwneschtrans' employees. Juschwneschtrans' employees do not attach any particular significance to these interviews which seem to have been merely an opportunity for Mishin to have a cordial chat with members of his staff. *(9)
