Soviet citizens, who are infiltrating gradually into Bulgaria and Rumania in groups, are applying for naturalisation and are being granted rights of citizenship. These new citizens are taking jobs in every branch of activity in these countries and are able to acquire all information they desire in military as well as economic spheres. 2. Russians coming into Bulgaria are settling in Stalin, Burgas, Ruse, Lond Silistra, Kerdshali, Newrokop, Stara Zagora, Vidin, Kyustendil, and Sofia, as well as in cities where there are military factories and depots, such as Karaniik. S. All the needs of these Russians, who bring their families with them, are being supplied. Their salaries are twice as high as Bulgarians in similar positions. Special courses, schools, clubs, libraries and health residences are provided for the Russian families. When they travel within the country the cost is very low. They are permitted to make frequent journeys to the Soviet Union to see relatives. 4. For two years the same thing has been occurring in Poland, Hungary and Czechoslovakia. In Bulgaria there are about 48,000 Russians, in Romania 35,000 to 37,000, in Poland 33,000 to 36,000, and in Rungary 28,000 to 30,000.
