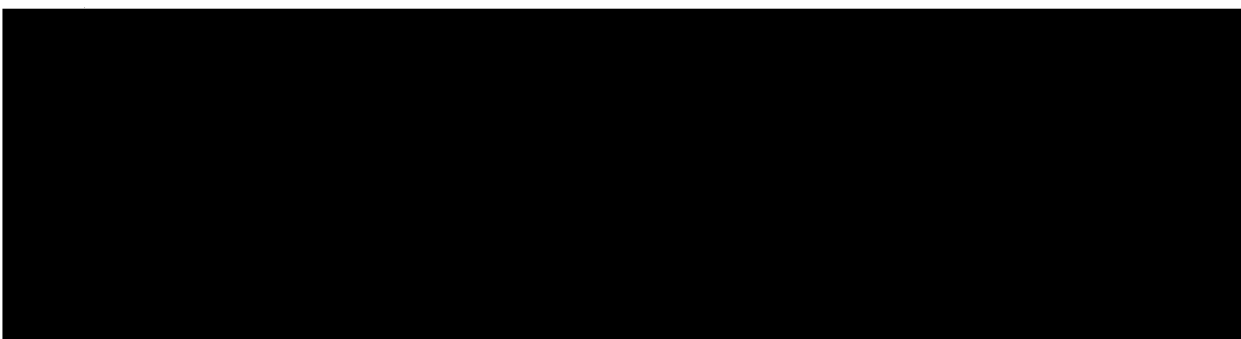

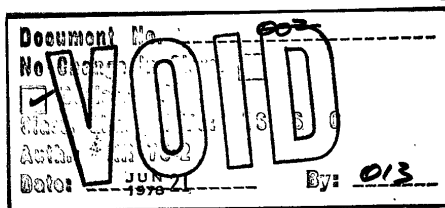

1. Jacques Duclos, member of the Politburo of the French Communist Party (FCP) and French delegate to the Cominform, stated at a meeting of the FCP Politburo on 27 June 1950 that he had "good reasons to believe that the USSR would avoid serious results developing out of Korean events". Duclos added that he did not believe that the USSR would leave the United Nations.
2. Etienne Fajon, also a French delegate to the Cominform, stated that Soviet Ambassador Alexei Pavlov had given strict orders to Soviet representatives in Paris not to comment on Korea.
3. No special communication has been received from the Cominform by the FCP indicating that there is to be any change in the general Party line, and for the time being at least the propaganda of the FCP will continue to revolve around the "peace" campaign, Duclos stated.
