

b. Tauentzien Kaserne on Osterburgerstrasse:

Occupied to capacity by infantry units primarily consisting of 18 to 20-year-old recruits. About 250 recruits marched out of the barracks in the evening of 2 March 1950. Motor vehicles seen there

c. Albrecht der Baer Kaserne:

ccupied by tank units with numerous recruits. Trucks carrying about 12 troops and towing a 76.2-mm AT gun each, were observed on 7 March 1950. Carrying 10 soldiers and towing a 76.2-mm AT gun, moved into the barracks area on 10 March 1950.

- 6. The following shipments were observed between 21 February 1950 and 3 March 1950:
  - a. 21 February 1950: Three officers and 36 unarmed infantrymen with baggage departed toward Magdeburg at 1 p.m.
  - b. one officer and 22 unarmed infantrymen with tages gase left in the same direction at 6:20 p.m.

- c. 24 February 1950: Thirty to forty new ZIS trucks were detrained between 10 and 11:30 a.m.
- d. 3 March 1950: Two officers and 78 unarmed HM with baggage departed toward Magdeburg at 4:50 p.m.
- 7. Three hundred to four hundred troops in groups of 10 to 20 left Stendal between 20 and 26 February. They left in a southerly direction at irregular intervals aboard scheduled trains. Two groups of soldiers had come from the Albrecht der Baer Kaserne. It was not observed that any shipments of weapons, vehicles, or equipment left Stendal.
- 8. A combat practice involving about 500 troops from the Albrecht der Baer Kaserne and the Tauentzin Kaserne, was held in the area west of the stendal-Wittenberge railroad line on 14 February 1950. Most of the troops were 19 to 20-year-old recruits. The exercise was directed by a lieutenant colonel. The troops practiced the attack by squads advancing under mutual fire protection and the digging of foxholes.
- 9. Tauentzien Kaserne:

occupied by about 1,200 troops, primarily recruits, of units of various branches of service. No heavy weapons were observed. --otor vehicles in the bar-

diers, totaling 300 to 400 men, practiced entrenching work, close-combat drill and the terrain description in the area north of the barracks, in the afternoon of 7 March 1950. Three platoons of about 40 men each marched from the Tauentzien kaserne to the Albrecht der paer Kaserne in the afternoon of 9 March 1950. The troops did not carry arms.

lo. Hindenburg Kaserne:

Occupied by about 1,500 troops, including recruits of units of various branches of service. Motor vehicles left

a. 3 March 1950: About 200 recruits were observed at combat practice near the road to Unglingen.

b. 7 March 1950: About 150 troops held training at squad level under the supervision of a major in the area between the barracks and the railroad embanks ment.

11. Albrecht der Baer Kaserne and restricted area on Herdenbergstrasse:

occupied by tank and artillery units, with a high unit headquarters on Hardenbergstrasse. The following observations were made:

- a. 6 February 1950: About 100 Soviet civilians, including some women, arrived aboard the regular express train from Zwickau (N 51/K 34) and took up quarters in the Soviet residential area.
- b. 15 February 1950: Fifteen tanks were parked in the barracks yard.
- c. 24 February 1950: Nineteen newly spray-painted trucks arrived by rail from the direction of Berlin.

- d. 4 March 1950: Three T34 tanks arrived from the direction of Gardelegen.
- e. 7 March 1950: Five trucks towing as many guns of about 100 mm caliber arrived.
- f. 9 March 1950: Three platoons, each of about 40 unarmed men wearing red-bordered black epaulets moved into the Tauentzien Kaserne. The troops were not observed to leave the barracks again.
- 12. No Soviet troops were seen in the training area south of Steats (M 53/Y 64) on 17 March 1950.

  An envelope bearing APN 62 000 A was found in one of the vacant twig huts.
- 13. About 50 troops were observed to be stationed in the former German Armed Forces settlement about 1½ km south of Boergitz (M 55/Y 64) on 17 March 1950. The quarters were being reconditioned. A signal section constructed a telephone line between the settlement and the trunk line along the Gardelegen-Stendal road.
- 14. The following observations were made in Stendal on 5 April 1950
  - a. Tauentzien Kaserne:

Five groups of about 12 soldiers held terrain training in the area of the former parachutists' camp.

About 400 troops on 15 trucks left the barracks for the training area on the road to Arnim at about 7 a.m., according to nearby residents.




