25X1X [REDACTED] 1. Three houses in the Red Mill Settlement, southwest of the Wittstock (W54/U 11) airfield, were evacuated on 14 April 1950. Two board sheds, each with four braced radio masts, about 6 meters high, were erected in the open field near the houses.

25X1X [REDACTED] 2. No aircraft were seen on the landing field or in the open hangars on 22 April 1950. Little progress has been made at the construction site on the western edge of the field. Two motor-driven plows were being used on the sodded landing field. Another construction site apparently was east of the field. Six dumpcars were seen there. The radar set previously seen was still on the plateau in the southeastern section of the field. [REDACTED]
