- The proposed drastic reorganization of the Kuomintang has not yet passed the stage of discussion and implementation by the Central Executive and Supervisory Committees.
- 2. The first appreciable local reaction to the proposed reform is among lower-level Kuomintang members, most of whom are now inactive. Their main desire is to disassociate themselves from the KMT, which they do not consider capable of reforming itself or resisting a Communist attack. While not contemplating immediate defection, they desire to have a clean political slate in order to continue in their minor business enterprises when and if a successful invasion is made.
- 3. The only enthusiasm thus far shown for the reorganization is among top-level standing committee members whose political lives depend upon reform of the party.
