- Taiwan and Tibet is the principal issue between top-level Chinese Communist Party leaders and the Party rank and file. The lower ranks are not absolutely opposed to foreign war, but they believe that a third world war is not likely to come and they look forward to a period of relaxation after the conquest of Taivan and Tibet. Leaders feel, however, that another war is inevitable and that Communist China must ally herself with the Soviet Union.
- 2. The CCP leaders have attempted to convince the lower ranks that they, too, desire peace after the fall of Taiwan and Tibet.
