1. No Soviet troops or materiel were observed in Apetlon (P 48/X 74) and its vicinity from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on 2 July 1950. * There were no military rail shipments on the Parndorf (P 48/X 77) - Wallern (P 48/X 84) line that day.

2. An unusually large number of troops, most of them wearing red-bordered black epaulets, were seen in the town and camp of Kaisersteinbruch (P 48/X 67) from 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. on 27 June 1950. Many officers were seen in the town. Field exercises involving T-34 tanks were held in the neighboring area. Trucks [REDACTED] all driven by soldiers wearing red-bordered black epaulets, were observed. All [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The tanks in this report may have belonged to elements of the 106th Gds Hv Tank SP Regt of the 13th Gds Mecz Div in Magran. Units of the regiment went to Magran for short training cycles according to a previous report by the same source. [REDACTED]
