1. An alert company (moto-ceta) of 80 soldiers was activated in Karlovac (Y 12/K 25) in May 1950, [REDACTED] 25X1X  
 [REDACTED] The unit had two light armored scout cars and an undetermined number of trucks used as personnel carriers. The soldiers were equipped with submachine guns and light machine guns. Captain Zelja Jovetic was the commanding officer.
2. It was said that units similar to the Karlovac company were to be activated in other military posts. These units were responsible for the prevention of sabotage expected to be committed with the help of the neighboring countries still within the Cominform.
3. In addition to the motorized alert companies, each battalion kept stand-by groups alerted at all times.
4. A reward of 10,000 dinars was officially offered for the apprehension of any saboteur.
