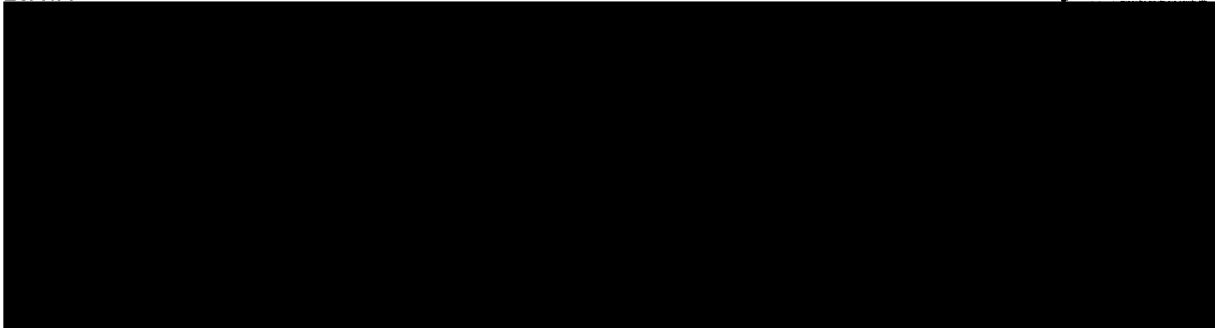

According to an investigation made by the Political Special Service Department of the Macao Police, Canton police inspector LI Yen-liang* was assassinated by order of the Communist South China Bureau. Assassination plans were originated by Communist labor leader LIAO Ssu-kuang** and carried out by two members of an action group (Hsing Tung Tui, 行動隊), WU Chien (吳劍) and LIAO Jung-hsi (廖榮禧).
2. The two assassins are living in Macao at the offices of the Nan Kuang (南光) Trading Company, Ho Pien Street, which is also the office of the Communist Special Commissioner for Macao.***
3. The governor of Macao has ordered the police not to treat this murder as a political case because he wishes to avoid a political incident. The police have tightened security measures, however, with the result that the Communist Party in Macao has ordered its members to cease all overt activities.
