25X1A 1. It was learned on [REDACTED] that a heavy artillery unit had moved into the Neue Kaserne on Scrbsterstrasse, Burg (M 53/Y 61), during the preceding week. About 100 soldiers wearing red-bordered black epaulets, some with artillery insignia, were seen training with nine 152-mm field howitzers in the Kraehenberg area on [REDACTED]. Upon completion of gun drill, the howitzers were towed to the barracks by caterpillar tractors.

25X1B 2. Other soldiers were observed training with three 76.2-mm AT guns, which were later towed to the barracks by truck [REDACTED].*

25X1A * [REDACTED] Comment. [REDACTED] reported on [REDACTED] that 25X1A the Neue Kaserne, Burg was occupied to capacity, allegedly by AAA units, which were possibly elements of the 3rd Gds AAA Div. [REDACTED] were seen in the Neue Kaserne in early [REDACTED]. It is possible that the heavy artillery unit mentioned in the present report, which moved into the Neue Kaserne about [REDACTED] had returned to its post in Burg, from the Altengrabow range. This unit may be an artillery unit of the Third Shock Army, the IV Arty Corps, or the 207th Itz Rifle Div. See [REDACTED] 25X1A
