- On 1 August 1950 CHANG Ai-poing (我爱萍), Commander of the Chinese 1. Communist East China Naval Area, accompanied eight Soviet advisers (the highest had a rank equivalent to colonel) from Shanghai to Ningpo, then by boat to Tinghai (122-06, 30-03), where they inspected sea approaches, water supply, warehouses, barracks and naval offices. They also inspected the port facilities of Shenchiamen (122-18, 29-58) and Kanlan (phonetic), north of Shenchiamen.
- The group took two gunboats to Changtu (122-16, 30-16) Island, where a naval port is being constructed in the narrow channel dividing the island, They visited Taishan (122-, 30-), Chintang (121-, 29-) and Puto (122-24, 30-00) Islands and carefully inspected the airfields on Tinghai and Taishan.
- After the tour ended on 15 August, the group returned to Tinghai, then went 3. to Ningpo on 17 August and to Shanghai.

Since these islands have deep water ports, no surf and geographical protection, the Soviets consider them excellent for naval development and will establish a submarine base at Tinghai. Tsingtao and Shanghai are the principal Communist naval ports. Sino-Soviet submarine fleets will be centered at Foochow and Wenchow.
