Since the end of June 1950, however, Yugoslav shipping has been impeded by the Soviet Navy Danube flotilla which has been engaged in maneuvers and practice firing exercises on the Lower Austrian Danube. According to Danube observers the Soviets sease fire only when Soviet petroleum tankers are in trensit from Lobau to Moosbierbaum For this reason and because they have no assurance of safe passage to Regensburg, five Yugoslav barges and two motor ships are now tied up at Vienna docks
