1. Thirteen boxcars occupied by 500 recruits led by a lieutenant and a junior lieutenant were en route from Negyeshalom (P 48/Y 06) to Eisenstadt (P 48/X 55), on 13 July 1950. The train record number was 29347. All the soldiers were black-bordered blue epaulets and marched without arms to the Jaeger Kaserne. Six boxcars loaded with about 250 recruits, also wearing black-bordered blue epaulets and led by a lieutenant and a junior lieutenant, formed part of the train, but were directed to Vienna-Stadlau via Parndorf (P 48/X 77). \*

2. Seven freight cars loaded with coal, shipment record number 64/0895, arrived in Misenstadt from Vienna-North on 14 July 1950. The sender

3. Seven freight cars loaded with timber, shipment record number 64/0849, were dispatched from Eisenstadt to Strasshof (P 49/S 50) on 15 July 1950.


