- c. <u>Technical Dept.</u>: Technical supervision and direction of the sport organizations; rules and technical literature; organization of the special committees for the 23 branches of sport (with the exception of "motor-sports", which are the responsibility of the Organization Dept.); composition of central sports events for every branch; selection of instructors from the technical point of view. 1 Chief, 18 Assistants.
- d. Culture and Education Dept.: Political indoctrination; supervision of the curricula of the sport schools; control of decorations; liaison with the FhJ Central Council. 1 Chief, 1 Deputy, ? Assistants.
- Finance Dept.: Control of funds; financing of sports events; auditing of school and committee accounts; management of money contributions from all sources. 1 Chief, 1 Deputy; 12 Assistants.
- f. Press Dept.: Publishes the "Sport Press Service of the DDR"; supervises the newspapers and magazines of the German Sports-Publishing Co. Supervises the sports news programs of the radio stations of the DDR. 1 Chief, 6 Assistants.
- g. Championship Dept.: Promotion and assistance of the best athletes (from the rank of "Landesmeister " up) by means of scholarships, priority supply of sports material, special ration eards, rest homes, etc. (presently provided for 1,300 top athletes); maintains a register of all first-class athletes. 1 Chief, 3 Assistants.
- h. International Sports Relations Dept.: Conduct and direction of international and interzonal sports events; procurement of passes, etc.; supervision of athletes who are abroad or in western Germany; supervision and maintenance of foreign and Jost German sports delegations. 1 Chief, 2 Assistants, currently operated by the Personnel Dept.
- i. Factory Sports Dept.: Development of central factory sports groups as the nucleus for the growth of mass sports on a large scale; liaison with FDGB; liaison with "Sport und Manderbedarfs GmbH" as supplier of all sports goods; liaison with "Jugendheim GmbH" as the owner of the sports fields and buildings. 1 Chief, 2 Assistants.
