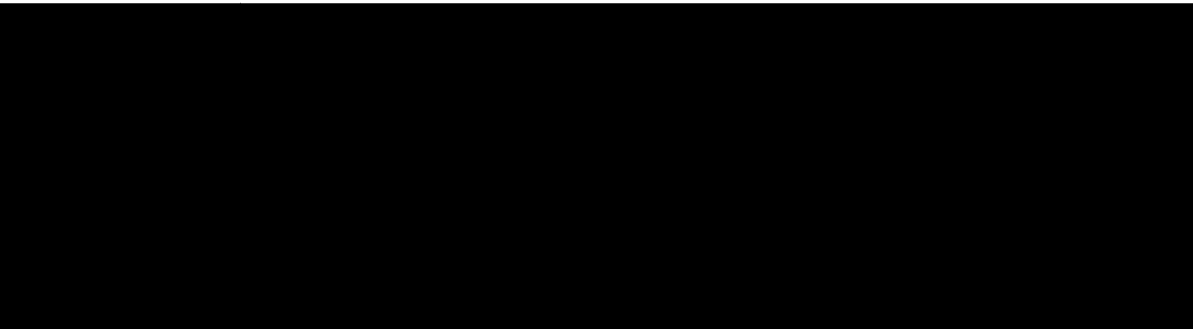

1. In offices of the Chinese Communist government, such as the Customs Service, in Peiping, all employees receive political indoctrination regularly. Study-discussion periods are held daily from 0730 to 0900, the first hour being for the study of books and pamphlets, the remaining half-hour for discussion and exchange of opinions. Lectures are given twice a week from 1500 to 1700, usually in the building auditorium, by Communist Party members who head secretariats. The lectures and discussion groups take precedence over any business duty of the employees.

2. Books used for political indoctrination studies have to be bought by the employees. The list used up to 1 May 1950 includes the following:

- Mao -- History of the Development of Socialism
- Lenin -- Political Economy
- MAO Tse-tung -- People's Democratic Dictatorship
- MAO Tse-tung -- New Democratic Doctrine
- U.S. State Department -- White Paper on China
- Discussion of the White Paper (pamphlet)
- MAO Tse-tung -- Three Main Outlines of Governmental Constitution
- CHOU En-lai -- Land Reform
- Goodby Mr. Leighton Stuart (pamphlet)

3. Employees are required to take an examination every two weeks over the books read and lectures heard. In an ordinary examination, usually taking up an entire afternoon, the questions are like the following:

- a. Detail the process of the development of socialism.
- b. Why will imperialism cease to exist?
- c. For whom are we using the dictatorship and why?
- d. Why is it necessary for us to "lean to one side"?
