- In offices of the Chinese Communist government, such as the Customs Service, in Psiping, all employees receive political indoctrination regularly. Study-discussion periods are held daily from 0730 to 0900, the first hour being for the study of books and pumphlets, the remaining half-hour for discussion and exchange of opinions. Lectures are given twice a week from 1500 to 1700, usually in the cuilding auditorium, by Communist Party members who head secretariate. The lectures and discussion groups take precedence over my business duty of the employees.
- 2. Books used for political indoctrination studies have to be bought by the employees. The list used up to 1 May 1950 includes the following:


