Fany Tabak, an outstanding woman Communist in Brazil who attended the Moscow Congress of the World Federation of Women in 1949, is an employee of the Rio de Janeiro municipal government and has been an active organizer among her co-workers for the Communist Movimento de Ajuda a Imorensa Popular (Movement to Aid the Popular Press--MAIP). She has a record of outstanding work in the feminine branch of the Party and has contributed articles to various Communist publications. In June 1950 she was reported to be the representative of Momento Feminino, Communist women's paper, at a convention sponsored by the Associação Feminina do Distrito Federal (Women's Association of the Federal District) in support of the Communist peace and anti-atom bomb campaigns.
2. Both Fany and her husband, Salamao Tabak,\* are believed to be of Russian nationality. The latter, who was formerly Secretary of Propaganda of the Communist Party of Brazil (PCB) and manager of the Communist publishing firm Editorial Vitoria Ltda., is now reported to be underground with other PCB leaders.
