1. [redacted] 600 artillery troops of the 44 Army and 3,700 troops of the 291 and 393 Regiments, 131 Division, 44 Army, entrained at the South Station, Canton, for the north. 50X1-HUM
2. [redacted] TSENG Sheng returned to Canton from Paoan, where he has been directing the reorganization of the Kwangtung-Kwangsi Column. After reorganization, the column will be dispersed to Huiyang, Tungkuan, Paoan, Panyu, Huahsien and other places along the Kwangtung coast. 50X1-HUM
3. [redacted] TENG Hua, [redacted] commander of the 15 Army Group, entrained at Canton for Hankow. 50X1-HUM

[redacted] Communist troops along the Sino-British border were as follows:

- a. Units of the 113 Division, 44 Army, \*\*\* under TENG Hsi-chieh (鄧錫節), \*\*\*\* south of Changmut'ou (114-06, 22-53), along the Canton-Kowloon railroad. Division headquarters, with two Soviet advisers attached, is near the railroad station at Changmut'ou.
- b. One special service battalion of the 113 Division of about 200 troops and one assault unit of about 100 men are near Shenchuan (114-08, 22-32).
- c. One battalion of the 113 Division of about 200 troops is at Nant'ou (113-56, 22-31).

[redacted] Communist troops along the Macao border were as follows:

- a. One regiment of the Kwangtung-Kwangsi Column was between Shihchi and Chionshan. One battalion of the Kwangtung-Kwangsi Column of about 300 troops was at Shihchi with regimental headquarters.
- b. A small detachment of marines from the Kwangtung Coastal Fleet was at T'angchiahuan (113-36, 22-22).

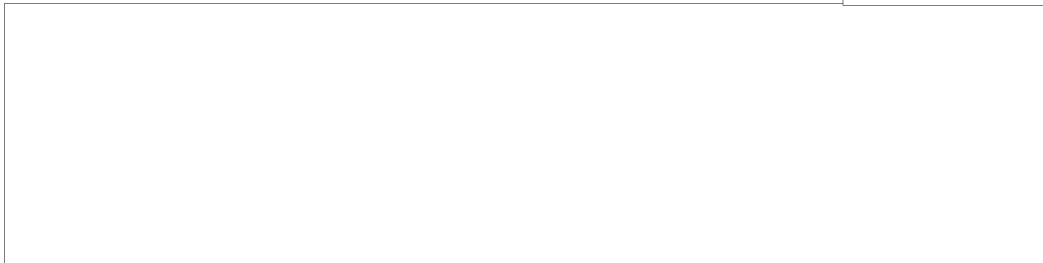
