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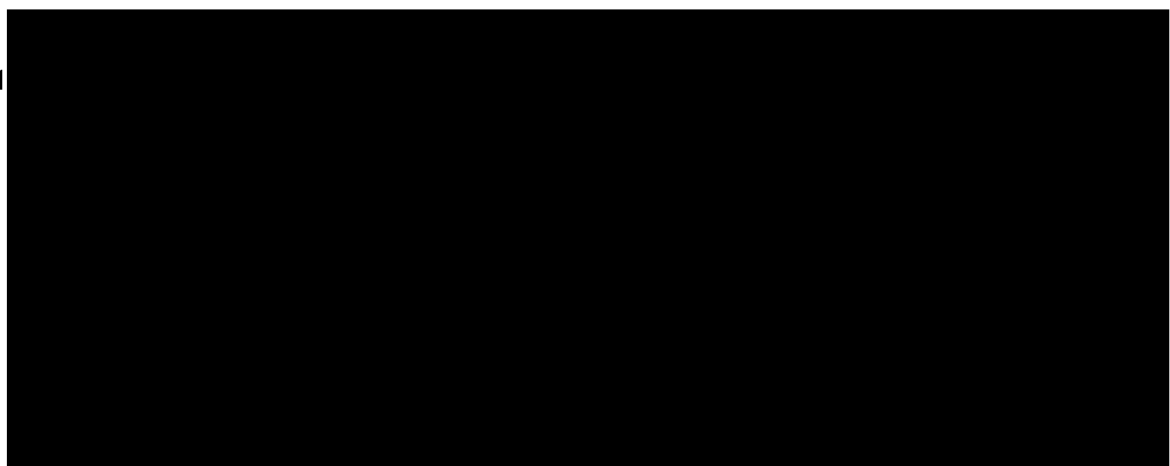

1. Jet planes made practice flights at Grossenhain (N 52/A 01) airfield about noon. The planes flew individually, in groups of two, and in one case in a formation of four.
2. About 1:30 p.m., when the flying had stopped, 20 to 30 jet planes with swept-back wings were standing at the landing field. Four other jet planes were beside the railroad line south of the field. One of the planes was [REDACTED] A twin-engine plane and a P-2 were also seen. (1)
3. The radar set which was on the northern border of the field on 1 August 1950 was no longer seen. The present location is not known. (2)
4. An antenna mast, 3 meters high and braced at heights of two and six meters by four guy wires each, was 80 meters north of the Grossenhain-Folbern (N 52/A 01) road, just west of Folbern. Four antenna wires ran from the top of the mast to the ground at an angle of 120°. A radio truck was beside the antenna mast. A power unit which was in use was also observed there. (3)

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
