THIS IS UNEVALUATED INFORMATION A construction of the second of the 25X1A Between mid-July and late August 1950, 180 trainloads of LIN Piac's troops, equipment and supplies were sent north from Kwangtung and Kwangsi. Of these, there were 14 trainloads of artillery troops and equipment and 22 trainloads of cavalry and equipment; the rest were infantry. A small part of these troops are stationed at Chinhuangtao and Yingkou. The main body of the 40,2 45,3 463 and 483 Armies are in the Mukden area along the Antung-Chian highway. In late August, 300,000 troops of the 4 Field Army were still in the outskirts of Hankow awaiting orders. The 41 Army, which has returned to Manchuria from Wuchang and Hankow, totals 90,000 men. The 42 Army totals 130,000 men and the 40 Army 8,000 (sic). Only a few troops are stationed along the Yalu River; the remainder are on the coast and in the countryside farming, but they can be assembled easily. In late August Soviet airfield construction was proceeding at Wafangtien, (122-02, 39-38), Pulantien (121-59, 39-24) and Sank'englipao (三坑里堡).
