1. On 14 August 1950 no aircraft were seen at the Neutranderburg-Trollenhagen (F 54/U 67) airfield. One open hangar was empty. About 300 air force soldiers were stationed at the field. There was no flying activity. \*

2. Two biplanes coming from the east landed at the field at 8:35 a.m. on 15 August 1950. One plane immediately took off again, heading southwest.

3. No flying was observed on 20 and 21 August 1950.

4. Seven jet planes and four single-engine fighters were parked at the field on 22 August 1950. No flights were made although the sky was clear and the visibility good [REDACTED]

6. On 26 August 1950 no flights were made at the field although the weather was good. Four jet planes with swept-back wings, very high rudder assemblies and swept-back elevator assemblies set high on rudder assemblies were parked on the large concrete site in the western section of the field.
