

- 1. After completing inspection of the Wanshan (113-, 21-) Islands in early September, LI Huai-chang ( ),\* chief of staff of the Chinese Communist Kwangtung Inland River Patrol Squadron, appointed LIANG K\*uei-t'ing ( ) as chief of the patrol area from Hsinhui (113-06, 22-34) to Chungshan (113-36, 22-22). LIANG was assigned the following boats: customs patrol boats numbers one through seven of the CHIEH FANG ( ) class, four motor-driven fishing boats, and four steam tugs. These boats were based at Peichieh ( ) north of Hsinhui.
- 2. The CHIEH FANG class patrol boats are 40 feet long, have a speed of 15 knots, and are armed with one 25 mm cannon, and two 15 mm machine guns. The motor-driven fishing boats have a speed of 10 knots and a gross weight of about 100 tons, and are armed with one small cannon.
- 3. The following customs patrol boats are now patrolling the Whampoa-Yangchiang (111-53, 21-52) area: HSIENFENG (先年), HAICHIEH (海大),\*\*\* and HAIKANG (海西).\*\* The 120-ton customs patrol boats CHUNGYUAN (中戶), and MINKUANG (民元) are now patrolling the Shangch'uan (112-, 21-) and Hsiachuan (112-, 21-) islands.
