1. Between 25 and 30 September 1950, the following Chinese Communist warships arrived at Nanshanwei (112-53, 24-16): the KUOKAI (果敢), 385 tons; the FEITOU (奮鬥), 80 tons; and the HAIWEI (海瑋).
2. On 29 September, the Chinese Communists set up a patrol command post at Tungao (113- , 22-). From 29 September to 2 October, one to three small Chinese Communist warships patrolled Tungao nightly.*
3. In late September two 15 millimeter cannons (sic) were emplaced on a hilltop on Tungao.
4. On 3 October, the SS CHEHP'ING (建平) left Canton for Chiangmen (113-06, 22-34) with 20 bazookas and 35 light machine guns aboard. These weapons were to be sent immediately to Headquarters 1 Battalion, 21 Regiment, in Shuinan-hsiang (水南鄉), northwest of Chiangmen.
5. On 6 October, the Chinese Communist gunboats CHEHP'ANG (解放) Number 1 and Number 2, formerly stationed at Wantzu (灣仔) in the Chingshan area, sailed to Nanshanwei (112-53, 24-16).**
6. On 6 October, 130 anti-aircraft personnel, with 6 Soviet-made anti-aircraft guns, were sent to the Wanshan (113- , 22-) Islands from Yink'eng (銀坑) and Maliushan (馬馬山), southwest of Macao, on the small Chinese Communist gunboat Number 52.***
