The two single-track steel truss bridges - 4 spans each - have an estimated weight of 2,200 tons. * 25X1C The bridge is on what was formerly the double-track Ducherow (N 54/U 99) - Karnin - Swinemuende (N 54/L 21) railroad line, which was totally dismantled. See Annex for sketch pinpointing location of bridge. It established the connection to the Isle of Usedon and was used chiefly as a feeder line for the seaside health resorts located on the isle, in addition to supplying the former naval station in Swinemmende. The bridge was blasted at the end of the war. The dismentling of the bridge shows that the reconstruction of this formerly important railroad line is apparently not intended in the foreseeable future.
