

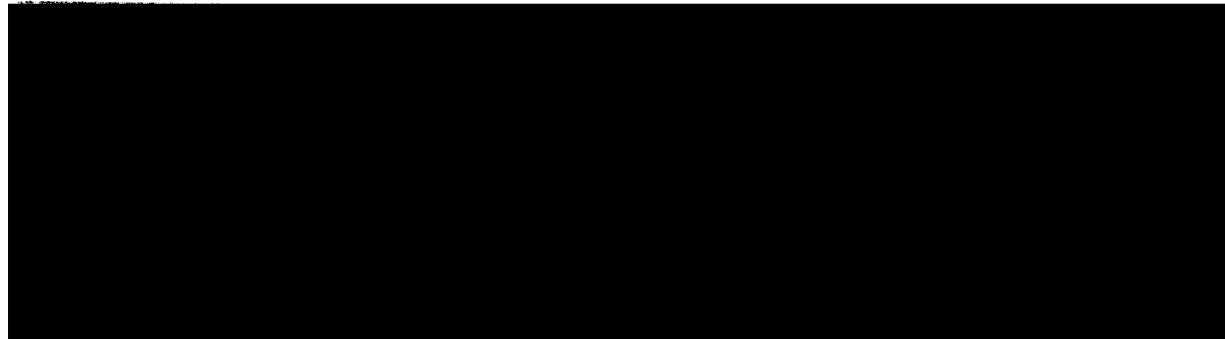

No gasoline from the USSR has yet reached Kabul under the terms of the Afghan-Soviet Trade Agreement. The amount of Soviet gasoline brought into Afghanistan to date has been insignificant. 25X1X

25X1A \* [REDACTED] Comment. Most of the gasoline imported under the Afghan-Soviet Trade Agreement of 1950 goes to Herat.

25X1A \*\* [REDACTED] Recent "unofficial" reports in the newspapers and on the local radio have predicted that gasoline would go off the nation in the very near future.

25X1X [REDACTED] Comment. As a result of the mere trickle of Soviet gasoline currently entering Afghanistan, gasoline will not and cannot go off the nation.
