They immediately went by boat on the Pearl River to Shihweit'ang (元 月 均). 2. 12 long range coastal guns, 500 cases of mortar shells, 300 cases of rifle ammunition, a large number of light and heavy machine guns, and a large amount of signal equipment were shipped to 50X1-HUM Kwangtung from Hankow. Kwangtung military authorities turned this material over to garrisons at the mouth of the Pearl River. 3. 10,800 tons of munitions, 8,100 tons of army uniforms, and about 1,400 tons of tanks and trucks were shipped south from Hankow on the Canton-Hankow Railroad. 4. 4,740 tons of gasoline and bitumen, 11,100 tons of food, and about 1,000 tons of foreign medicine and medical equipment shipped north from Canton on the Canton-Hankow Railroad.
