2. The southern section of the artilleric Kaserne on the southeast side of the road to Berlin appeared to be vacant. The garages there were empty. The northern section of the barracks installation was occupied. The heating system was in operation. An estimated 500 troops were seen engaged in various duties in the billcting area, while about 250 troops were simultaneously observed outside the billeting area or marching into the installation. Host of the troops were red-bordered black epaulets and only a few black-bordered black epaulets. Artillery insignia ware prevalent, while signal and motor transport insignia were seen only sporadically. Tank officers were seen between the two barracks installations. About 80 percent of the Eliwere young. They had closely cropped hair and seemed to be recruits. About hO groups, each of about 10 soldiers, received basic drill in the barracks yard. About 50 young soldiers practiced the construction of field fortifications in the area adjoining the installation to the south. The dump covered an area of about 200x300 meters and was surrounded by a barbed-wire fence. Eight barrels with muzzle brakes were seen in the large garage in the northeastern corner of the billeting area. 10.	About 50 soldiers wearing red-bordered black epaulets were seen moving about 150 boxes into the low storehouses of the ammunition dump which is located about 1 km south of the Artillerie Kaserne. A senior lieutenant of the tank corps and six to eight artillory officers were observed there.	
11.	In the northeastern part of the training area, about 3 officers and 100 EM were seen digging excavations, about 6x6 meters and about 12 meters deep. The excavations were presumably to shelter tanks or vehicles. **
