25X1 1. a meeting took place of the DDR Ministerium fuer Lanerdeutschen Handel, Aussenhandel und Materialversorgung routine business handled at the transport planning conferences. was presided over by Rothaupt, chief of the statistical department of the Generaldirektion. Also present were Golz and Feters from the Ministry's department of transport planning, Weber from the planing department of the Verkehrsministerium, managers of several Reichsbahndirektionen, and several observers from the Soviet Control Commission.

The reported delivery of 40,000 tons of rolling stock to Ploesti cannot be confirred. For such purposes there are, at the most, 2,400 2. 25X1 cars available. If the necessary tank cars had been sent as reported, the entire transport plan for petroleum products would have been thrown into confusion; this has not been the case. A small number of tank cars are occasionally exchanged with eastern countries.

3. The delivery of 250 tank cars to Brest-Litovsk 25X1 23 part of the reparations deliveries which are continuing regularly.

It cannot be ascertained whether or not tank cars were collected to the extent reported moving from Seddin to Ploesti Seddin 25X1 is a large central collecting point for the East Zone and is located between Michendorf, Potsdam, and Berlin. Here cars are collected for the purpose of making up trains of empty cars for new employment. In addition, it should be noted that Seddin is the most important freight dispatching point in the DDR. The report that 40,000 tons amounts to five-cighths of the tank car capacity of the East Zone is incorrect. the DDR had a total of 8,400 25X1 tank cars on hand for all purposes and of every type. Of these, at least 15 to 20% is constantly undergoing repairs. A total of 1,650 cars has been assigned exclusively to the delivery of chemical products. Seventy-six cars have been assigned to the transport of gas. Of the revaining cars, 2,400 are ${\rm MN}$ cars (tank cars for the transport of mineral oil), 900 belong to the reserve supply of the Deutsche Kraftstoff-und Mineralcel-Zentrale, and the remainder is rented or owned by the organizations which require this type of cor for their shipments.

By making full use of this type of transport, the East Zone has the means of transporting at least 240,000 tons per month, so that the reported 40,000 tons are no more than one-sixth of capacity. At the present time, the DDR Government is using an average of 168 tank cars daily for the shipment of petroleum products. This amounts to a total of 5,040 cars per month and a total volume of 100,000 tons.
