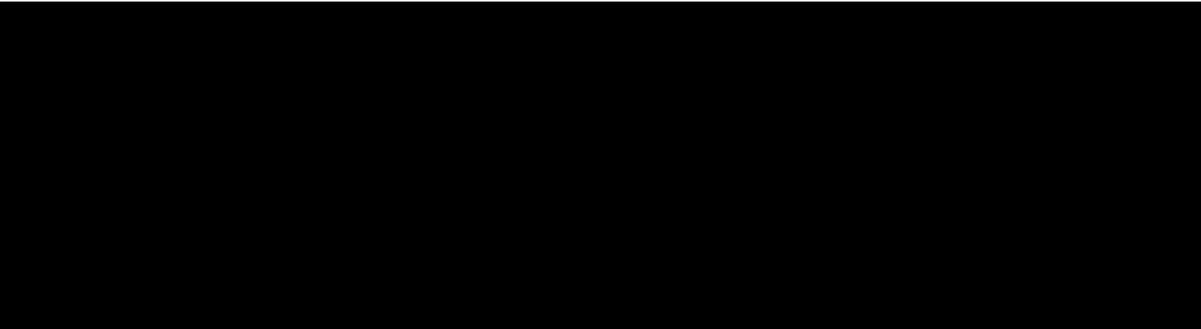

SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT NO.



1. On 8 December Stina* went to Macao, using the name John Wilson and a British passport with the number B 4637. His purpose in going was as follows:
 - a. To help the Chinese Communists expedite the transportation to mainland China of all stocks and supplies stored in Macao.
 - b. To direct the Macao office to assist in the transportation from Hong Kong of Chinese Communist stocks and supplies stored in Hong Kong.
 - c. To amalgamate all underground departments of such bodies as the Chungshan Military Control Commission (MCC), the Macao Labor Federation, the Communist Special Commissioner's Office in Macao and the Macao Students' Association into one intelligence organization.

2. On 12 December 1950 representatives of the Chinese Communist Special Commissioner's Office in Macao, the Chungshan MCC, the Macao branch of the Kwangtung MCC in Canton, the Macao Students' Association, the Macao Labor Federation and the Pearl River Military Sub-Area Headquarters held a secret meeting where they decided to unify and reorganize intelligence activities in Macao under a new organization, the Macao Anti-Aggression Committee (澳門反侵略委員會).

2. The members of the Macao Anti-Aggression Committee are as follows:

Adviser: Stina, vice chairman of the Sino-Soviet Friendship Association.

Chairman: CH'EN Han*.

Committee members:

LIANG P'ei** of the Labor Federation and HSI Wei-k'eng** of the Students' Association were to take charge of the Administration Department, concerned with the training and organization of agents and with recruiting for the armed forces.

K'O Lin of the Special Commissioner's Office and TU Lan** of the Chungshan MCC were to take charge of the Propaganda Department, concerned with anti-American, anti-British and international propaganda.

LU Wei*** of the Kwangtung MCC and CH'EN Hsiang (陳祥) of the Pearl River Military Sub-Area Headquarters were to take charge of the Special Activities Department, concerned with sabotage and assassinations.

YU Hua-chiao**** of the Chungshan MCC and MA Ling***** of the Special Commissioner's Office were to take charge of the investigation Department, concerned with collating reports and issuing orders to agents.

KUO Hsin-chien***** of the Special Commissioner's Office was to take charge of the Secretariat, concerned with correspondence and liaison. The Secretariat is divided into five sections:

- a. Sino-Macao Border Section.
- b. Macao Investigation Section.
- c. Combined Investigation Section.
- d. Special Missions Section.
- e. Liaison Section.

3. The Macao Anti-Aggression Committee was to have its headquarters in Dr. K'O Lin's clinic and its office for contacts at CH'EN Man's clinic, first floor, 1-J Hsin Ma Lu. In addition there were to be offices at the Hsing Kuang Book Store, Paimahang* and at the Hao Chiang Middle School** in the building where the Ch'i Huan Bus Company formerly had a repair shop.
