SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT NO.

- 1. In April 1950 YUAN Yao* was appointed by the Chungshan Military Control Commission (MCC) as chief of the action section under the Communist Special Commissioner in Macao. This action group subsequently became notorious for blackmailing Kuomintang officials in Macao and was officially disbanded by the MCC, but YUAN continued to be active. In August 1950, when the Pearl River Delta Safety Committee was organized to take over intelligence and foreign affairs activities, YUAN joined this group and in September returned to Chungshan to work in the MCC.
- 2. A battalion, consisting of ten sections, of underground agents has been organized at Shihch'i by the 6th military Control Sub-District. LIN Tso-sen (林代文) is commander of this unit. LIU Chin-hung (利克之), a native of meich'i (杨文文), Chungshan, is section head at Ch'ienshan (前山).
 LIANG Cho (尹文), a native of Shuitung (太文), is section head at Wantsai, from where he sends men into macao to observe the activities of political figures.
- 3. On 2 January 1951 the Central and South China Military and Administrative Committee sent HUANG Cheng-shen (黄正中) to macao as head of an 18-man section charged with the work of assassination.
- 4_{\circ} On 8 January 1951 WU Hai, head of the action group of the Pearl River District Director's Office, arrived in Macao with his deputy, LO Tao-shen (羅道中), and 16 followers.
- 5. On 7 January KUO Man-kuo (事 曼果), head of the Intelligence Department of the Awangtung Provincial Public Safety Bureau, arrived secretly in Macao and called a meeting of his workers, instructing them to accelerate their activities. Those present at the meeting were LO Hua-sheng (羅華勝)。 deputy chief of the Chungshan Communist Youth Organization; HUANG Jung (重复), propaganda chief of the Kwangtung-Kwangsi Column; and LIU Hua (g) 華), chief of the literary workers' group.
- In early January 1951 Chinese circ'es in Macao were greatly disturbed by
