1. The Macao information station of the office of the chief of staff of the Chinese Communist 3 Field Army Headquarters is headed by CHANG Lang (張朗), who arrived in Macao in December 1950. His deputy, CH'EN Chao-hsien (陳兆玄), arrived in Macao in November 1950 to open the station. In addition to these two, the staff of the station includes five office personnel and two communications personnel. Offices are maintained in the Ching Hu Hospital and at 50-E Salit'ou, with temporary liaison centers in the Chung Jung Hang (中榮行), 3-K Hai Pien Chieh, Salit'ou, and the T'ung Yun Shipping Company, Ch'i Kuan Terminal Building, Hai Pien Hsin Chieh. Direct communications are maintained with 3 Field Army offices in Shanghai and Canton.
2. The objectives of this station include information on the following points:
  - a. The military plans of the United States to assist CHIANG Kai-shek and LI Tsung-jen to attack the mainland, and the measures taken to implement these plans.\*
  - b. The present strength of the ground, naval and air forces on Taiwan, and its military defense works.
  - c. The military plans of the United States to aid Vietnam, and the practical measures to implement these plans, together with information on the French-Vietnamese military plans and their actual strength.
  - d. The anti-Communist activities of American and Kuomintang secret agents in Hong Kong, Kowloon and Macao, especially with reference to military activities.
