> The pro-Soviet group of the Chinese Communist leaders have made the following decisions:

- The political commissar of the 1 Army\* is to be in command, with P'ENG Te-huai as his deputy.
- TENG Hsiao-p'ing \*\* is to supplant LIU Po-ch'eng in command of the 2 Field Army
- JAO Shu-shih is to replace CH'EN I in command of the 3 Field Army.
- d. LIN Piac is to return to rear areas to recruit replacements; he is to find 800,000 recruits from Central and South China within four months and organize and train them into 40 divisions.
- The 5 Field Army is to be temporarily commissioned, with HSU Hsiang-chien (特 问 前 )\*\*\* as chief of staff. A 6 Field Army, under the command of NIM Jung-chen, is to go to Korea.\*\*\*
- The Chinese Communists have received the following orders from Stalin and the Soviet Government:
  - a. LIN Piac is to be made deputy commander-in-chief of the Chinese Communist
  - b. Members of the Chinese Government who are not working toward international Communism are to be purged before the beginning of a world war. This order has resulted in the pro-Soviet group in the Chinese Government ordering all surrendered Nationalist troops and other troops not sympathetic to them to be sent to Korca for extermination.
- 3. Members of the pro-Soviet group of the Chinese Government include LIN Piao, LI Li-san, JaO Shu-shih, and THW Hsiap pling. These men are opposed by MAO Tse-tung, TUNG Pi-wu, ... Yu-chang, HSO Hstang-chiten, CHU Te, CHIEN I, and LIU Po-ch'eng. The latter group has blamed the other for oppressing the Chinese people and the democratic elements of the Government and for hasty participation in the Korean war; for placing Stalin's orders ahead of EAO's, for twisting MAO's pronouncements and blocking all Government policies

The decisions of the pro-Soviet group to shift commands in the Chinese Communist Army were the result of the discovery of a plot by MAO to reduce the control of the pro-Soviet group by getting the cooperation of CH'EN I, YEH Chien-ying, CH'EN Keng, and LTU Po-ch'eng. A message to a subordinate of LTU, YANG Chien-ping, was intercepted, however, and the plot discovered.
