- (1) The same occupation was previously reported by the same source.

 Two fighter regiments and one fighter division headquarters are believed to be stationed in Laerz.
- (2) Type 16 jet aircraft. The cockpit is rather long because the plane is a two-seater and is used as a trainer.
- (3) To date, there have been no indications that a two-seater version of the MIC 15 exists. It is possible that the cabin roof of a MIG-15 was slid to the rear, giving the impression of a very long cockpit.
- (4) Same source reported previously that the Dumbo type radar set was removed from Rechlin airfield. See MML-11735. The radar set which was recently erected at the same location is a RUS-2 type.


