- 1. Between 8 and 13 February 1951, the Marstall Kaserne in Ludwigslust (M 54/T 53) quartered 800 to 1,000 troops who wore red-bordered black epaulets. About 100 soldiers received training in firing on 12 February.

[REDACTED] with about 50 soldiers wearing red-bordered black epaulets with tank insignia were observed in the tank training area south of the Techentin airfield on 8 February. Twenty officers wearing red-bordered black epaulets, some with artillery insignia, were seen in the tank training area on 13 February. Groups of two officers alternately mounted a JS tank to practice aiming. The officers were subsequently joined by 10 other officers who wore red-bordered black epaulets with artillery insignia. Three trucks, including [REDACTED] were used for driving practice at the airfield area, each truck carrying five student drivers wearing red-bordered black epaulets. **

- 3. On 17 February the Kavallerie Kaserne in the southeastern sector of Ludwigslust still quartered troops who wore red-bordered black epaulets. Some of the officers seen there wore artillery insignia. installation were numbered:

- 4. The Techentin airfield installation on the northern edge of the field was occupied by tank troops. T-43 tanks were in the garages. Other tanks which were covered with tarpaulins seemed to be of JS type. One of the T-43 tanks bore the number 236, followed by a small 5. The hangars on the southern edge of the Techentin airfield were occupied by tanks and guarded by sentries
